It is almost a year since the purchase of the beautiful historic St. John's Church, and much progress has been made.

The roof has been re-shingled.

All of the shingles except those on the towers have been replaced. Some of the work, however, was not done properly and repairs have already been needed. Special thanks to Troy, Dave, and the crew at Roof Medics for the repair work they have done.

The office area has been updated.

Sporting new paint and more efficient thermostats, it has been reconfigured into a waiting room and lesson room.

TSMH acquired the Greens and garage from St. John's Church.

Hopefully the sale of this property will help St. John's as they move forward with the construction of their new building. The garage has been invaluable for all the construction at TSMH, and perhaps the Greens will provide some opportunities for outdoor activities. I look forward to hearing your ideas!

The stage is in place.

This was the biggest job so far, and I send a big shout out to Johnny B Kowalchuk for his many hours of help over the long, cold winter. The new stage is a big part of the cool vibe in the Hall.

The pews have been slightly altered to accommodate more comfortable seating in the Hall and the loft.

For their youthful exuberance and fearlessness in lifting a pew up into the loft I send out crazy thanks to Preston Winkler and friends Logan, Isaac, and Cole. Preston and Logan also helped move a ton of stuff around the building and out to the garage. Great workers!

The loft pews needed some reinforcement.

The pews in the loft are from the original 1911 installation, and needed some repair work. Thanks to Aaron Feldkamp for help with the carpentry work.

Theatre lighting has been installed.

As always, little gets done without help, and Doug Zahorik & Son really came through in a couple of key moments to aid with the lighting project.

Some of the overhead lighting has been updated to LED.

Jeremy and his associates from Black-Haak did a great job on the lights, as well as the electrical for the stage.

Restoring the gutters to full functionality is underway.

The crew at Roof Medics are helping to solve the long standing gutter problem at TSMH. This is the first stage to fixing the seepage problem in the basement.

Both the MacDowell Male Chorus in late April and the Badger State Girl Choir in early May received rave reviews from all involved.

The Basement

The Grounds

The Clock Tower

The clock tower and the clock are in need of major work if they
are to brought back to full health. However, neither the clock
nor the tower are vital to the function of the Hall and its ability
to provide quality concerts to the public. The tower may
become a problem in the future if the structure starts to fail, so
a yearly inspection by a qualified engineering firm should be
considered.
